

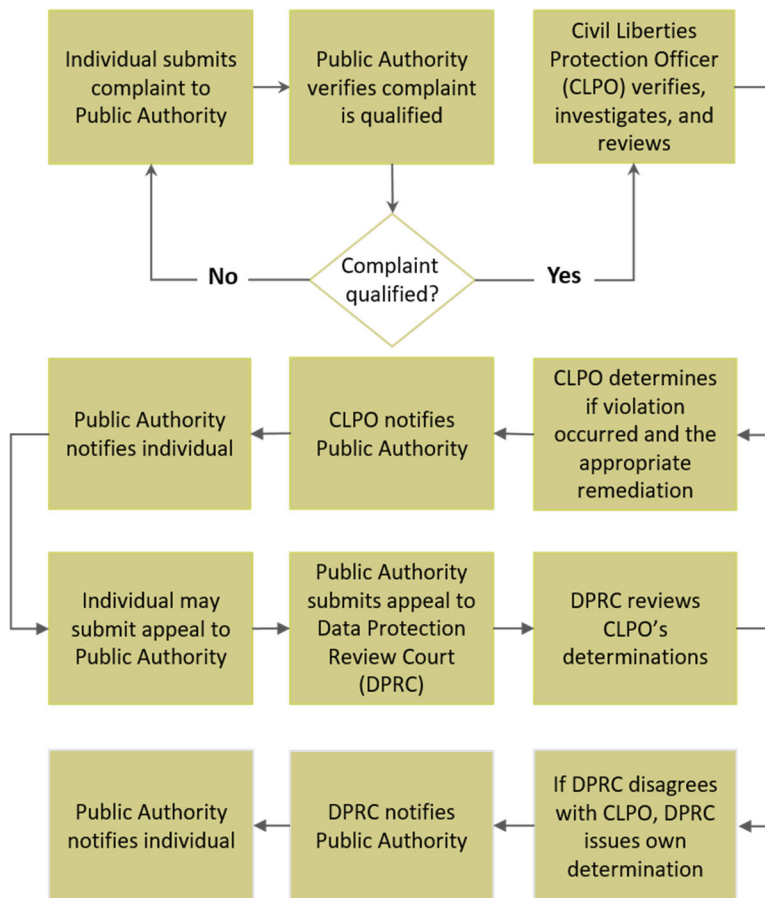

National Security Redress Mechanism

Process to review complaints concerning access and use of data by U.S. intelligence agencies in signals intelligence activities.

What is a National Security Qualifying Complaint?

Executive Order (EO) 14086 Section 3 establishes a redress mechanism to review “qualifying complaints” transmitted by the appropriate Public Authority in a qualifying state.

Before transmitting a complaint, the Public Authority must verify the following to show the complaint is a qualifying complaint:

- ❑ **Individual’s identity.**
- ❑ **Violation:**
 - ✓ Occurred after 7 October 2022 (the date EO 14086 was signed); and
 - ✓ Concerns data reasonably believed to have been transferred to the U.S. from the qualifying state after the effective date of the Attorney General’s designation.
- ❑ **Violation is about an individual’s personal data.**
 - ✓ Complaint is submitted by the individual or brought on behalf of the individual.
 - ✓ Complaint is not submitted as a representative of a government, nongovernmental, or intergovernmental organization.
- ❑ **Alleges a violation that:**
 - ✓ Adversely affects complainant’s individual privacy and civil liberties interests; and
 - ✓ Violates U.S. laws, orders, or procedures specified in EO 14086 § 4(d)(iii).
- ❑ **Provides basic information to enable a review:**
 - ✓ The basis for the complaint* and relief sought;
 - ✓ Specific means (such as an email address or phone number) the data was believed to have been transferred to the U.S;
 - ✓ U.S. Government entities believed to be involved (if known); and
 - ✓ Other measures the complainant pursued to obtain relief and the responses.
- ❑ **Complaint is in good faith and not frivolous or vexatious.**

****Complaint need not demonstrate that the individual’s data was in fact subject to U.S. signals intelligence activities.***

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
