Challenge

Assessing current state to anticipate the impact to the business

- Understanding current vendors/customers
 - Retrospective
 - Going forward
- Setting the stage
 - Clarify expectations
 - Establish a realistic workflow in light of resources and bandwidth
 - Frame to account for impact on closing impending deals as exemplar
- Identifying templates or systems to deploy for a repeatable process

DPIA/PIAs and ROPAs, Cont'd.



Challenge

Educating leadership and individual contributors


- Provide an overview of the law's requirements and risk examples in plain English
- Share examples of past contracts and the would-be impact
- Ensuring appropriate stakeholder are aligned and collaborate on the process
 - Include <u>data architecture</u>, <u>InfoSec</u>, <u>privacy</u>, <u>business owners</u> as working groups
 - Make it a practically-driven process with dry runs and walk-throughs to test the procedures against operational realities

DPIA/PIAs and ROPAs, Cont'd.



Challenge

Understanding assessments



- Determine the impact the potential risk will have, along with the likelihood of its occurrence
- Making the subjective objective
 - Create grids with input from those involved
 - Weighing the risks and mitigating factors

DPIA/PIAs and ROPAs, Cont'd.



Challenge

A template for each jurisdiction?

- Synthesizing regulatory schemes
 - Various triggers based on jurisdiction
- Determine the high watermarks
 - SPI definitions
 - High-risk processing activities
- Anticipating changes

Challenge

How to determine current state of compliance

- Understanding existing vendors
 - Mapping, data architecture, retention schedules assist with vendor types
 - Conduct interviews with <u>business</u>
 <u>owners</u>
- Developing objective measures
 - Create checklists, including jurisdictional nuances

Challenge

Managing different forms: 13 (and counting) different templates?

- Conduct baseline and retrospective analysis
- Determine a go-forward approach
- Don't ignore privacy policies

Data Processing Addendums and Vendor Management, Cont'd.



Challenge

Managing different forms: Everyone has their preferred DPA

- Navigate negotiations with pragmatism
- Including relevant jurisdictional deviations
- Implement Master Agreement or DPA controls
 - Consider checklists and decision trees
- How to address clickwrap DPAs

Challenge

Managing ongoing compliance

- DPA ownership
 - Will grow stale without dedicated ownership
 - Education to facilitate resource dedication
- Ensure ongoing compliance and safe harbor
 - Third-party processor/service provider due diligence
 - Period reviews, assessments on use, etc.
 - Working with <u>InfoSec</u>; building on existing tools
- Develop processes for new vendors
- No due diligence no defense

Challenge

Creating a baseline inventory – dealing with different definitions based on jurisdiction

- System considerations
- Third-party solutions vs. in-house
- Avoiding and managing gaps
- Ongoing education

Challenge

Maintaining an accurate inventory

- Consider technological solutions
- Determine ownership
- Conduct annual reviews
- Incorporate ongoing assessments; collaboration between legal and IT
