SCOPE & APPLICABILITY
The Act is extraterritorial – it applies to people and businesses no matter where they are located, even if outside of the EU.

UNACCEPTABLE-RISK AI
Prohibited unless an exception applies.

- Manipulation
- Exploitation of Vulnerabilities
- Biometric Inferences of Sensitive Data
- Social Scoring

GENERAL PURPOSE AI

- Create Technical Documentation
- Summary of Training Inputs
- Copyright Policy
- Additional Obligations for Systemic Risks: Assessments, mitigation, incident reporting, security

KEY DEFINITIONS

- AI System**
 - machine-based system
 - varying levels of autonomy
 - may exhibit adaptiveness
 - makes inferences
- Provider of AI**: Develops an AI system or puts the system into service.
- Deployer of AI**: Uses an AI system for professional activities.

TRANSPARENCY OBLIGATIONS

- Inform people they are interacting with AI
- Mark AI output as AI generated.

ENFORCEMENT

- EU AI Office and AI Board
- Fines up to 7% of global turnover or €35M for prohibited AI violations.
- Fines up to 3% of global turnover or €15M for other violations.
- Lesser fines for supplying faulty info.

HIGH-RISK AI
Significant risk for fundamental rights, public safety, or public health. Used as a product safety component or for uses listed in Annex III:

- Biometrics
- Educational and Vocational Training
- Migration, Asylum, and Border Control
- Employment Decisions
- Access to Essential Private and Public Services
- Law Enforcement
- Critical Infrastructure
- Public Assistance Benefits or Services
- Administration of Justice and Democratic Processes
- AI systems are high-risk if they profile individuals.

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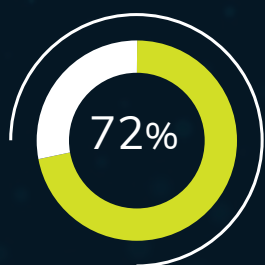
